Lift Safety Tips

- Wait Patiently: Always wait for the elevator to arrive at your floor. Do not attempt to force the doors open or close.
- Let Passengers Exit: Before boarding, allow existing passengers to exit the elevator. This not only is polite but also prevents overcrowding and ensures smooth movement.
- **Stand Clear of the Doors:** Avoid leaning on or standing too close to the elevator doors. Modern elevators are equipped with sensors, but it's always best to be cautious.

Common Rider Precautions

- **Avoid Overcrowding:** Every elevator has a weight limit, usually indicated inside the cabin. Adhering to this limit is crucial for the elevator's proper functioning and safety.
- **Hold the Handrails:** If the elevator is equipped with handrails, use them, especially if you're unsteady or the elevator is crowded.

In Case of Emergency: Familiarize yourself with the elevator's emergency buttons. In the event of a malfunction, remain calm and use the emergency communication system.
